A cache of discovered documents. A nail-biting escape. A story that resonates in these fraught times.

In 1940, thousands of Jewish refugees descended upon sunny Lisbon, desperately scrambling to acquire visas to escape Nazi-occupied Europe. Among them were Elsa and Saly Levi, a young German-Jewish couple who thought they had found safety in neutral Belgium—until Nazi bombs began to fall. Their eyes were fixed on America, but anywhere would do, as long they were far from the Nazis' reach. But there were others to consider: Saly's parents were trapped in Vichy France, and Elsa's mother in Berlin. Sister Erika in Palestine had suddenly grown silent, and brother Gerhard was interned in England.

In the Wake of Madness captures heartache and hope as history unfolds, from the pre-war period in Germany to 1950 New York. Armed with a wealth of personal documents, the author pieces together the nailbiting details of her family's escape. Her journey takes the reader to Germany, Belgium, Vichy France, Portugal, New York, Japan, Chile, Britain and Palestine as WWII scattered loved ones across the globe.

Like many immigrants, Denny's parents didn't speak much of those dark days. But as Elsa neared the end of her life, the stories came tumbling out. Decades later, her daughter unearthed boxes of papers and embarked upon her own journey to learn the secrets of those indecipherable letters.

Despite the inevitable heartaches, *In the Wake of Madness* shines a light on the courage born of necessity and the fierce desire for ordinary life.

Parallels to today's global tensions and political challenges are chilling – and the author includes a serious list of discussion questions that should keep any book group or classroom engaged. With the global rise in antisemitism and other forms of hate, combined with a growing appetite for authoritarianism even in the United States, *In the Wake of Madness* feels more relevant than ever.
